Mineola father and son duo to participate in Buzz-Off

Eight-year-old Alex Castillo, who is a Mineola third grader, and his father Mark are participating in One Mission's fifth annual Kids' Cancer Buzz-Off at AT&T Stadium on Sunday, May 4 to show solidarity for pediatric cancer patients and their families.

Alex had a biopsy on December, 6 2012 which revealed that he had a cancerous germinoma tumor located in his thalamus. He has gone through six months of chemotherapy and six months of radiation treatments.

Recently an MRI was done with results showing no signs of the tumor. Alex's father Mark said, "We have to go back every so often to verify the tumor has not become aggressive again."


The family is currently looking at rehabilitation options to help Alex with his right arm, which was affected by the tumor and he has, "trouble functioning with it," said Mark.

"Alex is currently playing his first sport since the treatment, soccer, and I am coaching his team. We decided to get involved with One Mission and the Buzz-Off because of all the support we received from friends, family and the community that can never be repaid. We know the struggle and financial toll cancer can take on a family and want them to know that they are not along and have support when needed," Mark said.

One Mission, a childhood cancer foundation, is dedicated to enhancing the lives of pediatric cancer patients and their families. The foundation provides help, hope, care and support to help children and their families cope with the many physical, emotional and financial challenges associated with

The Kid's Cancer Buzz-Off has raised nearly \$2 million for pediatric cancer patients and their families in four years. This year's goal is to shave 800 heads while raising \$1 million more dollars. Event organizers encourage everyone to help raise awareness of this year's "call to action" in order to help recruit more "buzzes" and raise support for these worthy children and their families.

"It was the scariest and most difficult time in our family's life and we just want to help ease that pain for other families that are going though the same struggle and show them that it can be done," Mark said.
